ENGINEERING PATHWAYS INDUSTRY CADETSHIP



The opportunity

In response to the industry's ongoing demand for entry-level site engineers, and as an initiative to drive even greater social equality outcomes, Training for the Future (TFTF), a Victoria government initiative, will once again deliver the Engineering Pathways Industry Cadetship (EPIC) program in 2024.

The program recruits qualified engineers from diverse backgrounds, assisting them to start a career in major transport infrastructure projects.

EPIC will exclusively recruit engineers from refugee or asylum seeker backgrounds, removing barriers to paid employment in Australia and opening up a talent pipeline for entrylevel site engineers on transport infrastructure projects.

The program will see engineering cadets undertake paid employment and training over 18 months to receive a Graduate Certificate in Infrastructure Engineering Management. This accredited qualification is customised to the requirements of transport infrastructure.

Expressions of interest are sought from refugee and asylum seekers with a Bachelor Degree in Engineering (civil, electrical or related) to participate in this exciting program.

How to apply?

The program commences in October 2024. Specific entry requirements need to be met and interested applicants must attend information sessions being delivered in May 2024 to find out more about the prerequisites.
